## **RE: GEPA 427 STATEMENT**

Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) requires that grant applicants under the Department of Education included a statement on how the LEA will ensure equitable access to federally assisted programs for students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries with special needs. The statute highlights six types of barriers that can impede equitable access or participation: gender, race, national origin, color, disability, or age.

- 6. **Anti-Discrimination Policies**: Our District has robust anti-discrimination policies in place to prevent discrimination based on gender, race, national origin, color, disability, or age. These policies are enforced consistently.
- 7. **Outreach and Engagement**: We actively engage with parents, students, and the community to gather feedback and address any concerns related to these barriers. Open lines of communication are essential.
- 8. **Data Collection and Analysis**: We regularly collect data on student outcomes and experiences, disaggregated by gender, race, national origin, color, disability, and age. This data informs our strategies and interventions.
- Continuous Improvement: We are committed to continuous improvement and will adjust our policies and practices as needed to create a more equitable and inclusive educational environment.
