




WHY DO WE HOLD TITLE I MEETINGS?

According to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), section 1116(c)(1), schools that receive Title I funds must invite and encourage parents to attend and participate in the process of creating Title I plans. You have a right to be involved in your child's education, and Garfield County School District LOVES parent involvement!

## WHAT IS TITLE 1?

Passed in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. It provides supplemental funds for students to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and helps close educational achievement gaps. Title I provides funding for academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children.





Schools are allocated Title I funds based on the percentage of students eligible for free/reduced lunch.

Schools in Utah receive school-wide Title I support if 40% or more of the student population is eligible for free or reduced lunch. Below 40%, of Utah schools receive Title 1 targeted assistance.

### HOW DOES GCSD USE IT'S FUNDS?


- Garfield County School District uses it's Title I money to provide multi-tiers of academic support (MTSS).
- The funding helps to pay for paraeducators in the classrooms and intervention labs who provide target tiers of support for students in the classroom who need extra help.
- Some schools use a small portion of their funds for reading, math, and science materials.



## Data & Results

Data is available to each school. Please look for testing results and data from your child's teacher(s) and during parent-teacher conferences. Data is collected through assessments at the Beginning, Middle and End of the school year. Examples of school-wide Assessments include:

- Acadience Reading and Math Data
- IReady K-6 Reading Data
- Spire language lessons
- The KEEP & PEEP

► Timely notice if your child has been assigned to, or taught, for 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not state-qualified. Your school is required to send you a notice if this is the case.

► To request information on the professional qualifications of your child's teacher or paraeducator. To make a request, contact your child's principal of head teacher.
